# How it works.

#### Who can go?

You don't need any special talents, skills, experience or gear. All you need is a curious mind, an open heart, the desire to learn, the drive to explore and to be between 14 and 18 years old. If that's you - then welcome!

#### **Choose from 21 countries.**

Choose from USA, Canada, UK, Ireland, Australia, New Zealand, France, Spain, Italy, Germany, Austria, Swizerland, The Netherlands, Finland, Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Costa Rica, Argentina, China and Japan. Often you can choose a specific region, city or school and even combine two countries in one year.

# Choose your lenght of stay.

Our programmes are usually flexible do a full academic year or just one semester or even just one or three months.

#### Get prepared.

First you will be offered events, and info-meetings. You can also follow current students on instagram, this is good for info and inspo. Close to departure you will attend a pre-departure orientation and, on your final destination, a few days long welcome camp.

#### Your new family.

Homestays offer a behind the scenes look at the local culture and daily life, and your host family will of course be your main support. Our families come in many shapes and sizes, but what unites them is their strong passion and curiousity about cultural exchange.

#### Your local support.

You'll have a whole network of people ready to help you with whatever you need. Your host family will be your main support, but you'll also have a local coordinator and STS staff back in your home country who will check in with you regularly and who you can contact anytime.

The best thing on my exchange was the life long relationship that I developed with my host family, the new friends that I created and the experiences I had travelling with my host family and other exchange students.


I learnt perseverance, resilience and confidence to live in a completely new environment. Being pulled out of your comfort zone really allowed me to flourish and develop as an individual.
